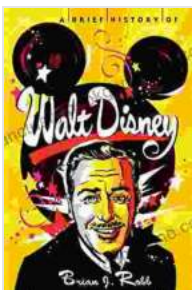


Brief History of Walt Disney: The Man Behind the Magic
