
From Bluebonnets to Pyramids: A Year in Egypt



- Have fun and enjoy your trip!

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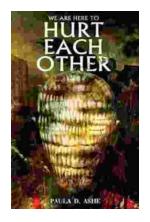
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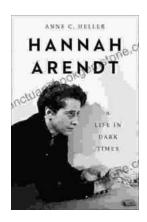


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
